The council also agreed to allow the city landfill to recycle HDPE pipe, which is used in the coal-bed methane industry. City staff says recycling the pipe will save money, save space in the landfill, and increase recycling.

The council also approved changing the official zoning map to include the East Side Planned Unit Development, a

large residential and commercial project proposed near the intersection of Grinnell Avenue and Connor Street.

The development is the brainchild of Whitney Benefits Inc. of Sheridan and is expected to ultimately include 95,000 square feet of office space, 45,000 square feet of retail and 36 new residences.

The council also approved transferring the liquor license for Loyal Order of Moose Lodge No. 164 from 331 Broadway to 1080 Brundage Lane Suite B. The The Moose Lodge has been at the Broadway location since 1955 and has outgrown the facility.

The council also designated a moment of silence for former city employee Alfred Kinter, who died Thursday. Kinter worked 34 years for the Water Treatment Plant. He was 61.
