All students need a high school education so that they can make a living and can enjoy the pursuit of success and happiness that all people should freely seek."

Committee representatives will include Whitney Trustee Val Burgess, Whitney Trustee Everet McGlothlin, Sheridan High School principal Dirlene Wheeler, Sheridan County School District #2 Trustee Bill Bradshaw, Sheridan County School District #1 Tongue River High School Counselor Pete Kilbride, and Sheridan County District Attorney Matt Redle as the committee chairman. Kinnison said, "This committee pulls together the educational commitment and strengths of the county to make measurable change in the successful completion of students finishing high school. This can change and stimulate a cultural difference in how the student and the community view the value and benefit of their education in Sheridan County".
